## What Canada is doing

As of spring 2010, approximately 50 personnel from the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and Canadian police agencies, as well as 40 Canadian Forces military police are working with the Afghan National Police (ANP) to help make Afghanistan's south safer. In Kandahar province alone, more than 2,000 ANP officers have been trained.

In addition, personnel from Correctional Service of Canada have trained approximately 100 corrections officers. They are helping to improve detention facilities.

Canada is also helping to strengthen the justice sector by organizing workshops on criminal law and procedure for justice officials in Kandahar province.

By 2011, Canada expects the ANP, supported by a stronger justice sector and more effective corrections capabilities, will be better able to promote law and order in key districts of the province.
